PAYMENT OF MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION FEES TO BE ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN THE UPCOMING SINUSA ELECTION.

This notice serve to inform you the above subject matter.

The Solomon Islands National University Students Association (SINUSA) election will be proposed to be prematurely held this year in the spirit of SINUSA Constitution. Hereof awareness programs will be organized and shall reach out to all your faculties in the coming weeks.

Hereunder, the requirement to be eligible to vote in the election is a student must be a registered student of the University and must be a financial member of SINUSA. This means students who have paid their school fees and have also paid his or her constitutional membership fees of \$100.00 for one calendar year to be eligible to vote in the election.

Please note that any student who has not registered with the University and has not paid his/her financial membership fees shall not be allowed to vote in the election nor be member of SINUSA.


Hereof all registered students of SINU who have not paid their students membership fees with SINUSA are encouraged to pay their prescribed fees now and be a financial members of SINUSA.

To be a member of the SINUSA is not mandatory. However, students are encouraged to be members of SINUSA to ensure whatever issues surrounding their education and welfare while studying at SINU are represented and administered accordingly by the SINUSA.

Should students wish to pay their membership fees, they can do so by depositing the subscription fee of \$100.00 at the Bank of South Pacific, SINUSA Bank account: 2000990503 and to bring their bank deposit receipt to the Finance Office at Kukum Campus for confirmation and to be receipted.
